New Features

Features introduced with VERITAS Storage Foundation 4.1 *for Oracle RAC* include:

- ◆ Support for the VERITAS product installer
- ◆ VERITAS Storage Mapping
- ◆ VERITAS Storage Checkpoints
- ◆ Changes to the VCS resource list and hierarchy. The `Qlogckd` resource is removed from the VCS resource list. The `SQLNet` resource is replaced by the `Net1snr` resource.
- ◆ Support to enable VCS to control VxFEN. The user has an option to include VxFEN in VCS configuration file (`main.cf`).

Hardware Requirements

Review the hardware compatibility information on <http://support.veritas.com> for details. VERITAS routinely updates the list of supported hardware items.

- ◆ Server systems must be one of the HP-UX systems listed in the “Supported Hardware” table. For this release, VERITAS Storage Foundation *for Oracle RAC* supports RAC clusters of two or four nodes. VERITAS recommends that each system have two CPUs.
- ◆ Disk space, locally: approximately 20 GB; review the installation requirements in the *VERITAS Storage Foundation for Oracle RAC Installation and Configuration Guide*.
- ◆ RAM, minimum per each server node: 2 GB.
- ◆ Shared storage: The storage units used by Storage Foundation 4.1 *for Oracle RAC* must support and be enabled for SCSI-3 Persistent Reservations (PR), a requirement for I/O fencing.



Software Requirements

VERITAS Storage Foundation 4.1 *for Oracle RAC* requires the following software items:

HP Operating Systems

All nodes in the cluster must run the same level and release of the HP-UX operating system. SFRAC 4.1 requires the September 2004 (also called AR0904) HP-UX 11i Version 2.0 (B11.23) release for HP 9000/Itanium servers, 64-bit. If necessary, upgrade the operating system to this version or a later version.

To identify the Operating Environment (OE) currently installed on your system, use the `swlist` command. For example:

```
# swlist | grep HPUX
HPUX11i-OE-MC                B.11.23.0409    HP-UX Mission
    Critical Operating Environment Component
HPUXBaseAux                  B.11.23.0409    HP-UX Base OS
    Auxiliary
HPUXBaseOS                   B.11.23         HP-UX Base OS

    Tools Bundle, Sep 2004
```

The output of this command includes a line that identifies the installed OE. For example:

```
HPUX11i-OE-MC                B.11.23.0409    HP-UX Mission
    Critical Operating Environment Component
```

All systems in a cluster must have the same operating system and patch level.



Checking Currently Installed Patches

Use the `swlist` command. For example, to check for patch `PHKL_31500`, type:

```
# swlist -l patch PHKL_31500
```

Software Limitations and Known Issues

The following issues exist in VERITAS Storage Foundation 4.1 for Oracle RAC.

Installing Oracle Binaries on a Cluster File System

The two sections below describe issues stemming from installing Oracle binaries on a cluster file system. To fix these problems generated by the operating system, HP will release an HP-UX patch. Information will become available in the following TechNote: <http://library.veritas.com/docs/277395>.

Unmounting Mount Points for Oracle Binaries

If you install Oracle binaries on a cluster file system and unmount the mount point on one node, the oracle instances and listeners running on some or all of the other cluster nodes fail. To safeguard against this problem, VERITAS suggests two alternatives:

- ◆ Move the following shared libraries for Oracle from `$ORACLE_HOME/lib/` to the local file system: `libodm9.sl`, `libskgxp9.sl`, `libjox9.sl`, `libwtc9.sl`, and `libclntsh.sl.9.0`.

For PA clusters, the path is `/usr/lib/pa20_64`. For IA clusters, the path is `/usr/lib/hpux64`.

- ◆ Install the Oracle binaries on the local file system.

hawizard Impact on Oracle Listeners and Instances

If you install Oracle binaries on a cluster file system and use `hawizard` to add the oracle service group to VCS, the oracle instances and listeners running on some or all of the other cluster nodes fail.

To safeguard against this problem, VERITAS suggests moving the following shared libraries for Oracle from `$ORACLE_HOME/lib/` to the local file system: `libodm9.sl`, `libskgxp9.sl`, `libjox9.sl`, `libwtc9.sl`, and `libclntsh.sl.9.0`.

For PA clusters, the path is `/usr/lib/pa20_64`. For IA clusters, the path is `/usr/lib/hpux64`.

hawizard Requirements for Oracle Database and Binaries

The wizard requires the Oracle database and Oracle binaries exist in separate file systems.

Bringing CVMVolDg Resource Online After Stopping VCS with -force Option

If you stop VCS with the `-force` option, CVMVolDg resources in service groups other than the CVM service group do not start when you restart VCS. You must manually bring the CVMVolDg resource online:

```
# hares -online cvmvoldg_resource -sys node_name
```

In service groups other than the CVM service group, volume resources for the CVMVolDg resource remain running after you issue the `hastop -force` command. This situation occurs even though you must bring the CVMVolDg resource online.

swconfig on PHKL_31500

Run the following command prior to running the installer utility:

```
# swconfig PHKL_31500
```

HP-UX Panic; Port h Halts

The HP-UX operation system may panic when HAD fails to communicate with GAB within a predetermined interval. Verify whether you need to tune the operating system to accommodate the workload. Some tunable parameters to check are swap space, operating system, and application parameters.

Deporting and Importing of Shared Disk Groups

If you manually deport a shared disk group, the CVMVolDg agent does not automatically reimport it as a shared group. You must manually reimport it as a shared group.

Importing Shared Disk Groups After a Reboot

CVM may not successfully import shared disk groups after a cluster node completes a reboot. The CVM disks appear in the `ERROR` state instead of the `ONLINE` or `ONLINE SHARED` state.

Run the `vxdisk scandisks` command to clear the `ERROR` state. You can then restart CVM and import the shared disk groups.



vxfersthdw Requires "+ +" in /.rhosts File

The `vxfersthdw` command requires `remsh` permissions to all cluster nodes, including the one on which you run the command. The `/.rhosts` file must contain a "+ +" character in the first line.

Removal of SFRAC Configuration Files

If any of the following configuration files are present prior to running the `installer` utility, move or rename the files:

- ◆ `/etc/llttab`
- ◆ `/etc/llthosts`
- ◆ `/etc/gabtab`
- ◆ `/etc/vcsmmtab`
- ◆ `/etc/vxfendg`
- ◆ `/etc/VRTSvcs/conf/config/main.cf`

Shutdown for Systems with I/O Fencing Configured

The I/O fencing feature protects against data corruption resulting from a failed cluster interconnect, or "split brain." See the *VCS User's Guide* section titled "VCS Communications, Membership and I/O Fencing" for a description of the problems a failed interconnect can create and the protection I/O fencing provides.

I/O fencing uses SCSI-III Persistent Reserve keys to implement data protection. Keys exist on I/O fencing coordinator disks and data disks. The VCS administrator must be aware of several operational changes needed when working with clusters protected by I/O fencing. Specific shutdown procedures ensure keys are removed from coordinator disks and data disks to prevent possible difficulties with subsequent cluster startup.

Using the `reboot` command rather than the `shutdown` command bypasses shutdown scripts and can leave keys on the coordinator disks and data disks. Depending on the order of reboot and subsequent startup events, the cluster might warn of a possible split brain condition and fail to start up.

Workaround: Instead of using the `reboot` command, use the `/usr/sbin/shutdown -r now` command to perform a graceful reboot for systems.

VERITAS FlashSnap Agent for Symmetrix (Not Supported)

SFRAC does not support the FlashSnap Agent for Symmetrix (EMC TimeFinder) mapping functionality (package: `VRTSfas`).

Storage Checkpoints Require Version 6 File System Layout

File systems for Storage Checkpoints must use file system layout version 6. Use the `vxupgrade(1M)` command to check the current layout version and change the version if necessary.

Note After you upgrade a system to layout version 6, the file system is no longer compatible with VxFS 3.5 file systems.

When upgrading a CFS file system, issue the command from the primary node. Use the following command to determine the primary node for a cluster file system:

```
# /opt/VRTS/bin/fsclustadm -v showprimary file_system_mount_pt
```

On the primary node, use the following command to check the current file system layout:

```
# /opt/VRTS/bin/vxupgrade filesystem
```

If the file system layout is not version 6, upgrade it. For example:

```
# /opt/VRTS/bin/vxupgrade -n 6 filesystem
```

Refer to the `vxupgrade(1M)` manual page for more information.

Accessing Version 6 File System when Removing VxFS

A disk layout Version 6 file system created with VxFS 4.1 software is not accessible if you remove the VxFS 4.1 software and revert the system to VxFS 3.5. In addition, if a disk layout Version 6 file system exists on a boot disk and you remove the VxFS 3.5 software, the host does not reboot successfully and remains at the `bcheckrc` prompt. To reboot the host successfully, first edit the `fstab` file and comment out entries for disk layout Version 6 file system.

Space-Optimized Volume Snapshots (Not Recommended)

When using VM volume snapshot functionality in an SFRAC cluster, avoid the space-optimized instant volume snapshot that may degrade performance.



VCS Enterprise Agent for Oracle Error Handling

The VCS enterprise agent for Oracle provides enhanced handling of Oracle errors encountered during detailed monitoring. The agent uses the reference file, `oraerror.dat`, which consists of a list of Oracle errors and the actions to take. Refer to the *VCS Enterprise Agent 4.1 for Oracle Installation and Configuration Guide* for description of the actions.

Currently, the file specifies the NOFAILOVER action for the following Oracle errors:

ORA-00061, ORA-02726, ORA-6108, ORA-06114

The NOFAILOVER action means the agent sets the resource state to OFFLINE and freezes the service group.

You can stop the agent, edit `oraerror.dat`, and change the NOFAILOVER action to another action that is appropriate for your environment. The changes go into effect when you restart the agent.

Storage Foundation for Oracle RAC in Japanese Locales

Japanese VEA Does Not Display Correctly on English Windows

To avoid garbled characters, do not change the font setting in the **Preference** dialog box when using the VEA client in non-English locale (including MUI).

Under Windows MUI, change the user interface language using the **User Locale** setting instead of the **UI Language** setting under **Regional Settings** in the Control Panel.

Incident Number	Description
124005	Unable to configure or unconfigure VCSMM and VxFEN. Panic may occur when GAB is not configured, and <code>uninstall</code> may fail.
126795	Oracle instance fails with <code>ksfd_odmiol</code> and <code>ksfd_odmcr2</code> (file number) errors. Check VCS log files, operating system log files, and console messages for any errors.
127013	<code>uninstall</code> or <code>swremove VRTSdbac</code> fails during module configuration. Disable VXFEN, VCSMM, and LMX startup scripts to prevent configuration of these modules during system startup.
128348, 128627	<code>uninstall</code> can generate system panic if processes using the CFS mount point are running.
110518	<code>fstyp</code> may fail on VxFS file systems. Several commands that call <code>fstyp</code> , including <code>vxassist</code> and <code>fsadm</code> , may also fail.
